The Bali Process Regional Support Office (RSO) was established in 2012 to provide technical support to Bali Process Members and to strengthen regional cooperation on refugee protection and international migration, including human trafficking and people smuggling. The RSO is the only cooperation mechanism of its kind in the region.



The Bali Process on People Smuggling, Trafficking in Persons and Related Transnational Crime was established in 2002 to focus on long-term strategies to address the crimes of people smuggling, trafficking in persons and other related transnational crime in Asia and the Pacific.

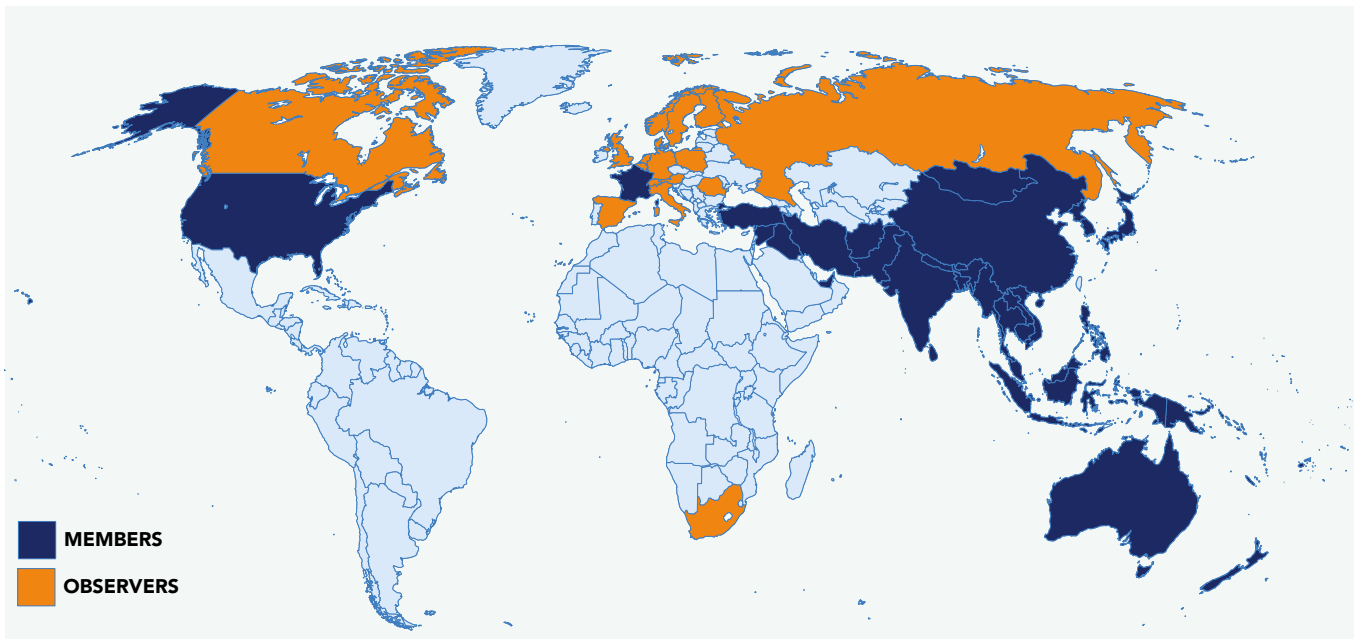
